AIMS

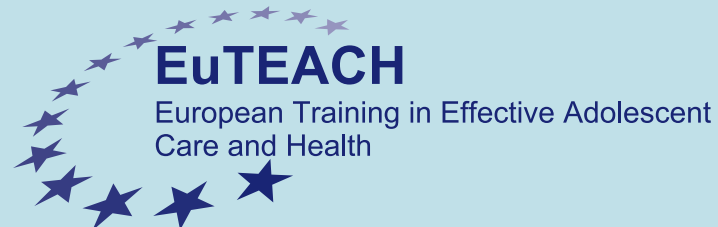
The summer school will use interactive educational methods to enable participants to:

This should include a one page CV and a short letter of motivation to the organiser. Acceptance of the application will be acknowledged shortly after reception of the application. INFORMATION

The course takes place on the campus of the University of Lausanne. The campus, which is on the shores of lake Geneva, offers a wide variety of sports and other facilities.
